- Free home delivery is offered for all orders placed prior to Friday 5 December.
- MPS does not take booklist orders, these are all done via the Winc Education website.
- Please bring your stationery pack to the classroom on the first day of school, Wednesday 28 January 2026.
- There is no need to name any items as this will be done in class.

Step 2: Summary - Financial Contributions/School Fees:

- You can pay your financial contributions via Compass from 1 January 2026.
- Payments can be made in instalments throughout the year or in one lump sum.
- Curriculum Contributions if paid in full are \$242.00 for the entire 2026 school year.
- Donations can also be made to our MPS Building Fund, and any donations made to our Building Fund are tax-deductible.

Free delivery: for orders placed on or before 5th December 2025

\$12.95 delivery: for orders placed after 5th December 2025

Orders under \$60 will incur a delivery fee

Orders placed by 19th December 2025 will be guaranteed for delivery prior to the commencement of term 1 2026

Orders are delivered via Australia Post's eParcel service. As soon as your order is dispatched an email will be sent to let you know the Australia Post tracking ID number. Your order can be tracked at auspost.com.au

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
